- 1. Chalice Lighting and Spiritual Reflection
- 2. Endowment Start-up—Bruce Koepcke shared updates regarding endowment start-up project which church began two years ago.
  - UUSMC has reached \$10K minimum to open endowment account
  - For now UUSMC will let annual dividends accrue in account; can change that decision at any time
  - UUA accepts only direct deposits
  - Several people being considered to be authorized to deposit into account and to change
    % rate of accruals into account

    - Adam Kegley
  - Hundreds of churches already in endowment program
  - Once approved and established UUSMC will establish a legacy giving project
  - BOT approved account 6/11/20
- 3. Approval of Minutes—BOT approved May 2020 BOT meeting minutes
- 4. Summer Solstice event and building use policy
  - Jamie Kegerise wished to hold outdoor summer solstice event
  - BOT discussed safety concerns and agreed to following terms
    - Event will be promoted to members and guests of members
    - Masks required at all time
    - Social distancing
    - Limit to 10 in building at time
    - All doors locked in building except bathrooms
    - Limit of 2 or a single family unit in bathroom at a time
    - Cleaning crew will clean thoroughly afterwards
- 5. Celebration of and lessons from first virtual Annual Meeting
  - BOT pleased with virtual Annual Meeting and attendance
  - Congregants have expressed approval of Annual Meeting
- 6. Minister's Report
  - Discussion regarding possible pastoral internship for Heather Petit
    - H. Petit finished Lancaster Theological Seminary and would like to intern with UUSMC

- Internship is whole ministry experience including pastoral care, worship, and administration
- Internship in UUA usually 9 months and paid
  - H. Petit would intern Sept-June 15-20 hours per week for two years; not expecting salary (typical financial obligation would be \$962/month PT)
  - H. Petit is highly skilled and would bring great experience to congregation while fulfilling internship requirements
- BOT raised concern that internship does not burden G. Pelly—he affirmed he would look forward to H. Petit's internship
- BOT will further explore and decide before or during next BOT meeting in July
- 7. Treasurer's Report
  - End of year report—appear on track to end year with \$3.0K surplus
  - Financial Policy and Procedure guidelines have been updated
    - Will add addendum for planned giving as program is designed
    - Will add addendum for endowment policies and procedures
  - BOT decided that Finance Committee and Endowment Committee will be separate entities
- 8. Review of Summer RE and overall planning for autumn 2020
  - Summer RE
    - RE Teams contacted parents regarding summer RE
    - Chalice Children parents request only simple ideas for RE; other RE parents appear to want summer break from RE
    - Anna Hull has simple lessons for Chalice Children to connect with Nature over summer; post info regarding plants, insects, etc.: possibly use Roots and Shoots FB page
    - Youth can listen to sermons with parents if interested
  - Fall RE
    - Soul Matter exploring online options for classes
    - Some churches have been holding RE via Zoom
    - We will explore if UUSMC families are interested in Zoom lessons
    - UUA World magazine has section for family worship and activity
    - Soul Matters Sept packet arrives July 1 and Oct packet arrives Aug 1
  - Adult RE—Karen Rege may possibly use Zoom meetings if Adult class is interested
  - Overall plan for Fall
    - Beginning in July, augment uploaded recorded messages
      - Around 11 AM open Zoom sessions for Joys and Sorrows and breakout groups of 3 or 4
      - Will promote upcoming changes to congregation in advance
